## Highlights CON AMORE 2022

### Autobiographical Memory in Ageing and Dementia

On September 27-28, 2022, CON AMORE organized the international conference *Autobiographical Memory in Ageing and Dementia* at AIAS, with 8 keynote speakers and 2 invited speakers. Close to 90 researchers from more than 15 countries participated and around 50 posters were presented at the conference. It was the ninth international conference organized by CON AMORE since 2010.

### Scientific output

In 2022, CON AMORE had 42 articles published or in press/accepted for publication. One book (monograph) and three book chapters were also published/in press in 2022.
